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HISTORY OF THE COLLECTION

Up until six years ago, the Hewlett Homestead on Port Washington Boulevard was one of the few remaining 18th century houses on Long Island which had been lived in continuously for eight generations without interruption by the descendants of the original builder, in this case Lewis Samuel Hewlett I (1686-1729). In 1981, Elizabeth Hewlett Hopkins' and Doctor Milton Hopkins' decision to sell the 400-acre family property occasioned a thorough search of the 21-room manor house, four outbuildings and two barns. During this process of "above-ground" archaeology, Dr. Robert Mackay, Director of the Society for the Preservation of Long Island Antiquities (SPLIA), discovered a small room in one of the barns, yielding trunkloads of papers, documents and maps dating back to the original settlement of Port Washington in the 1600s. Comprising financial documents, diaries, legal records, scrapbooks, photographs and printed materials and correspondence, a preliminary inventory of the Papers revealed a cohesive and all-encompassing record -- amounting to about 25,000 items -- of the development of Port Washington and environs between the 1680s and 1916, with the bulk of materials relating to the Hewlett Family's role in the changing economic and political fortunes of Long Island between 1810 and 1860.

Volunteers from the Cow Neck Peninsula Historical Society originally sorted through and itemized some of the documents. About 100 others were added to the archives of The Society for the Preservation of Long Island Antiquities in Setauket. In December, 1984, the Port Washington Public Library officially received the Deed of Gift from the Estate of Dr. Milton Hopkins and Mrs. Elizabeth Hewlett Hopkins. Similarly to manuscript donations before them, the Hewlett Papers were initially processed both with intellectual control and a preservation plan in mind. Since they had been kept in an attic that had not seen the light of day for perhaps 100 years, it was not too difficult to keep their original order, and our goal was to do as little rearranging as possible. Invaluable advice at this critical processing stage was offered by archivists Arthur F. Sniffin (President, Long Island Archives Conference) and Evert Volkersz (Head of Special Collections, SUNY-Stony Brook).

An early assessment of the condition of the collection resulted in basic preventive measures, such as removing staples, paper clips, rubber bands, cleaning dusty pages with document-cleaning pads, carefully unfolding bundles, interleaving with acid-free paper when necessary, and placing items in acid-free folders placed in acid-free boxes and stored in a closed area of the library on open steel shelving. About two dozen 17th century documents which showed signs of fungus were separated out and are awaiting treatment by a conservator. Crumbling 19th century newspaper pages intrinsic to the collection were encapsulated and kept (if not duplicated elsewhere on Long Island). These measures, although accepted archival procedure, do not prevent

further chemical deterioration from taking place, and those papers that are brittle (mostly 1850s on), account books with disintegrated bindings (c.25) and destroyed or fading photographic images (c.20) must be treated by a trained conservator/restorer. Fading ink is likewise a concern on c.26 documents from the reign of George II. Although dead insects fell out of a few of the bundles as we unpacked them, there were few signs of insect damage. Likewise, although many of the 19th century documents look discolored and are brittle, the "pH" of the paper remains to be tested. Problems of wear and tear were particularly worrisome.

All of these concerns prompted us to apply for funding from the 1988/89 Conservation/Preservation Discretionary Grants Program of the New York State Library. We received notification of the award in March, 1988, which provided for microfilming of the Hewlett Papers to make them more accessible to researchers while sparing the original manuscripts from over-handling and unnecessary exposure. Plans were made with the New England Document Conservation Center to film the collection, and hand numbering of each document was required in order to expedite the final film-to-document check. This laborious task was accomplished over the next five months with the help of Port Washington Library volunteers Caryl Hooper and Renee Fertig, and part-timer Ruth Summers. In July, 1988, the collection was sent to the NEDCC in Andover, Massachusetts. Filming was completed by November, 1988, and the collection was delivered back to Port Washington. The task of reviewing the twenty-six microfilm reels and sending Roll #1 and parts of Roll #12 back to the NEDCC for re-shooting was finished in March, 1989. The thorough and painstaking preparation of the microfilm guide by Librarian/Archivist Peggy L. McMullen marks the final stage in the processing of the microfilm collection at the folder level, and Pat Coleman patiently pulled together all of the project's loose ends. A complete name index, to be completed at a later date, will additionally enhance the usefulness of the microfilm.

BIOGRAPHIES AND GENEALOGY

Among the papers found in the Hewlett barn in 1981 were the privately printed "Genealogical Notes of the Hewlett Family of Long Island and Massachusetts," compiled by Lewis S. and Oliver T. Hewlett in 1819. All of the best recognized biographical entries on this prominent family, e.g. Peter A. Ross' History of Long Island, Benjamin F. Thompson's History of Long Island and Paul Bailey's Long Island, agree that in the beginning there was George Hewlett, "one of the judges who passed sentence on the death of King Charles, in the Reign of Oliver Cromwell (who) fled England at the restoration of the Royal family." Originally sharing the hospitality of the Riker family on Riker's Island, the family then dispersed to various parts of Long Island -- some to the South Shore, where the town of Hewlett was named after the family, and to Rock Hall in Lawrence, now a well-preserved museum. Others went to the North Shore where they built homesteads at Cold Spring Harbor, Great Neck, Roslyn, Port Washington and Plandome, where George Hewlett was appointed "cow keeper" in 1658. Because of the wide net cast by the Hewletts on Long Island, their correspondence and business papers cover a larger area than Port Washington, although the bulk of their papers deal with local matters.

Much has been written about the genealogy of the Hewlett Family (see Bibliography). An article in the Cow Neck Peninsula Historical Society Journal by Dr. Milton Hopkins and Mrs. Elizabeth Hewlett Hopkins documents the longstanding tradition in the Hewlett family that the eldest son alternate the names of Lewis and Samuel. The tradition was broken only once -- when Maria Thorne Hewlett (1796-1882) named her son Henry Thorne Hewlett (1827-1900). Succeeding generations continued in the customary Lewis Samuel or Samuel Lewis mode. An outline of the Hewlett family genealogy and brief biographical sketches of key members (in rough chronological order) is attached.

The nature and content of the Hewlett Family Papers reflects to a large extent both the occupations and political positions of family members. Whether as founder of St. George's Church in Hempstead (Lewis S. I, 1703), or officer in the French and Indian Wars (Richard Hewlett, 1750s), or chairman of the Queens County Agricultural Society (Lewis S. II, 1817), or President of the Port Washington School Board (Samuel Lewis IV, 1890s), each succeeding generation of Hewlett sons passed on to the next the correspondence and papers relating to his public office. It is for this reason that a nearly unbroken record of decades of institutional history -- in the fields of agriculture, transportation, church history, education, political and legal history, and family history -- has been kept intact for researchers to use. Similarly, the family businesses were a thread that held generations together, from George Hulet's (sic) earliest farming accounts (bills and receipts, 1650s-1690s), to James Hewlett's packet ship business records (1805-1813), to William Henry Hewlett's paper and cotton manufacturing and saw

mill books (1810s-1840s), to Samuel Hewlett IV's canning factory accounts, recipes and correspondence (1880s), and up until the family's historic first automobile dealership, with John F. Remsen, in Roslyn in 1892.

As Long Island agriculture shifted to vegetable gardening for city markets in the early 1800s, the Hewletts were in the forefront. As investor attitudes shifted away from packet ships to steamboats in the mid-1800s, the Hewlett's stock holdings changed. As new technologies and industrialization were introduced into farming communities in the late 19th century, the Hewletts were among the innovators in farming machinery and labor-saving devices. And as private sector methods were used to accomplish the transportation revolution on Long Island in the second quarter of the 19th century, the Hewletts were among the movers and shakers. Prominent landowners, farmers, manufacturers, lawyers, merchants and entrepreneurs, the Hewlett's status in the community over eight generations placed them in a unique position to collect, and hand down, important written information concerning the growth and development of their hometown. Here, in one place, through one family's experiences, can be studied in microcosm and fine detail the economic, political and social realities of everyday life that shaped Long Island and, by extension, much of the Eastern seaboard during critical periods of growth and development.

GEORGE HEWLETT (1634-1722)

Came to America from England, first settling on Riker's Island. Had four sons -- Daniel (oldest, settled in Merrick), George (settled in Great Neck), Lewis (settled in Cow Neck), and John (settled in Rockaway). Recorded in the Town of Hempstead records as pasturing his cows on Cow Neck as early as 1657 and as a "cowkeeper of Gattes Rights" in 1658. His name appears frequently in these records during the following decades, as he amassed a considerable estate in the area. In 1683 he owned 28 acres of cleared land in the town of Hempstead, 28 cattle and one horse.

LEWIS SAMUEL HEWLETT I (1686-1763)

One of four sons of George Hewlett, Lewis Samuel I was a "husbandman," or commercial farmer, who raised sheep, cattle and hogs which, along with crops, were sold in New York City. He was the original owner of the Hewlett Homestead, built in 1713 on a 400-acre property, which extended to Hempstead Harbor. He was an Overseer of Highways and was also involved in the maritime trade. His will, dated 1763, bequeaths to his sons, Samuel Lewis Hewlett I and James I, "all my houses, buildings, lands and improvements, which I have lying on Cow Neck ..."

SAMUEL LEWIS HEWLETT I (1712-1800)

A farmer who also ran a line of packet ships to the West Indies in the 1780s.

JAMES HEWLETT I (1717-1805)

James I resided on the ancestral property on the west side of the present-day Port Washington Boulevard, and, like his father, married twice. In his will dated 1801, James I, having no sons, devised "all the lands and meadow lying in North Hempstead and in Hempstead and all my negroes ... to James Hewlett, son of my brother Samuel Hewlett deceased."

JOHN HEWLETT (d.1812)

Of Flushing, had a country grist mill and saw mill ("West Farm" in Oyster Bay). His estate was settled by Lewis Samuel II.

LEWIS SAMUEL HEWLETT II (1776-1846)

A farmer whose land extended to Hempstead Harbor, he was well-educated and served in various public capacities, such as: Chairman, Queens County Agricultural Society in 1817; State Legislature in 1828; Commissioner of Highways, 1830s; and Justice of the Peace. He was the Executor for Charles Hewlett (Huntington) and John Hewlett (Oyster Bay). Local legend has it that he built a house on his farm for homeless travelers, where they could be temporarily lodged and fed.

CHARLES HEWLETT (1776-1829)

A brother of John Hewlett (of Flushing), owned 7 1/2 acres, a house, store and dock adjoining Cold Spring Harbor. Involved in farming and shipping.

JAMES HEWLETT II (1780-1815)

The captain of a packet ship, James II sailed for St. Bartholomew in the schooner "Hannah Aurelia" on January 20, 1815 and was never heard of again. He was unmarried, and owned property in Queens.

SAMUEL LEWIS HEWLETT II (1782-1859)

Resided on the South Shore. Married Maria Van Wyck in 1823, the daughter of Isaac Hewlett.

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WILLIAM HENRY HEWLETT I (1784-1866)

The youngest son of Samuel Lewis Hewlett I, William Hewlett owned and operated a successful grist mill and paper mill which were located opposite the Plandome Mill. William was also a manufacturer of cotton goods, and, in 1827, built a saw mill. By 1863, William owned all the property to the South and East of Leeds Pond in Plandome. His first wife was Martha, a daughter of Thomas Thorne.

WILLIAM HENRY HEWLETT II (1827-1898)

William Henry went to school in Flushing. The only son of William Henry I, he succeeded at his father's death to the management of the grist mill and continued farming on the extensive surrounding lands, which had been part of Mitchell Acres, Manhasset, in the mid-1800s. William Henry ran the Tower Stables in New York City, was an Overseer of the Highways in the 1890s, and became increasingly involved in banking toward the end of the 19th century.

SAMUEL LEWIS HEWLETT III (1803-1865)

The eldest son of Lewis Samuel II, he lived in a house on Hempstead Harbor with his wife, Maria Thorne, until his father died, at which time he moved into the Hewlett Homestead on Port Washington Boulevard. Running the farm, cider mill and paper mill, Samuel Lewis Hewlett was also a Trustee of School District #4 (1830s), Treasurer of the North Hempstead and Flushing Turnpike Road and Bridge Company (1860), a Deputy Collector for the IRS (1865), and Treasurer of Christ Church, Manhasset, from 1851.

STEPHEN D. HEWLETT (1805-1830)

Second son of Lewis Samuel II, Stephen practiced law in Queens County and had an office at 241 Pearl Street in New York City. He never married.

HENRY THORN(E) HEWLETT (1827-1900)

Educated at local schools and later the Academy at Roslyn, Henry Thorn Hewlett ran the Hewlett Homestead and Farm, a cider mill (1860s), and a fleet of packet ships. He was a member of the Hook and Ladder Company (1856-66); Overseer of the Poor (1857); Treasurer, North Hempstead and Flushing Turnpike Company (1860s-70s); and served as Executor for William Henry Hewlett II.

STEPHEN R. HEWLETT (1857-1915)

With his brother, Samuel Lewis Hewlett IV, ran a canning operation in Flower Hill from c.1885-c.1891, based on excess produce from the Hewlett Farm. In 1890 the brothers opened a pickle factory at 206 Front Street in New York City. Vestryman, Christ Church, Manhasset. Secretary/Treasurer of Port Washington School Board.

SAMUEL LEWIS HEWLETT IV (1863-1929)

Educated at Granville Military Academy, Samuel Lewis IV lived in the Hewlett Homestead until his marriage to Mary Phillips. He then built a house overlooking Hempstead Harbor on land later sold to the Metropolitan Sand Company. When his mother and brother died in 1915, he moved back to the Hewlett Homestead. He was a member of the Hook and Ladder Company (1902), Port Washington School Board President (1904-9), and Treasurer for forty years of Christ Church, Manhasset. Also served as Vestryman and Junior and Senior Warden. With Stephen R. Hewlett, he established the Roslyn Manufacturing Company in the late 1880s; with George Hankinson, "Hewlett and Company" for pickle manufacturing in 1890. In the 1890s he became involved with roadbuilding and was selected Superintendent of the Mack Paving Company in 1898. In his later years he established an automobile dealership with John F. Remsen, "Hewlett and Remsen" (1892).

MARY REBECCA PHILLIPS (1870-1954)

Family home ("Haydock") on West Shore Road, Roslyn. Descendant of John Hart, signer of the Declaration of Independence. Graduate of Friends Seminary, New York (1887). Attended Swarthmore College, Pennsylvania 1887-89. Interested in Civic Affairs, Church Women's Group. Staunch supporter of Christ Church, Manhasset. Member, League of Women Voters, Village Welfare Society.

ELIZABETH ROBBINS HEWLETT HOPKINS (b.1912)*

Descendant of two lines of the Hewlett family. Graduate of Port Washington High School. Attended Skidmore College, Saratoga Springs, New York, and graduated from Adelphi College, 1937, BA (Sociology); Member of Kappa Kappa Gamma Fraternity. Married Dr. Milton Hopkins, 1944. Member, National Society Colonial Dames XVII Century; Secretary of Board of Trustees Family Consultation Service, Episcopal Diocese of Long Island; Directress, Christ Episcopal Church Altar Guild; President, Board of Church Women United, North Shore; Member, Landmarks Committee, Cow Neck Peninsula Historical Society; Daughter, Rebecca Hart Hopkins, b.1946, m. James E. Powers, 1969.

SCOPE AND CONTENTS

Early documentation left by the Hewletts begins with a packet of 17th and 18th century material, notably a deed of George Hewlett, dated 1683, and daybooks of Lewis I for the years 1714 - 1740; also, receipts for forage for New Hampshire volunteers, 1780, plus about 300 letters, deeds and receipts regarding the Hewlett's farm operations.

Of special importance is a proclamation of Sir William Howe, New York, 1777, allowing shipment of goods to Hempstead Harbor. These documents are valuable as artifacts as well as for their intellectual content. Other formats represented in the Papers are: 1) legal documents, late 18th and early 19th century, from the law practice of Stephen D. Hewlett, some signed by John Jay, with leather-bound ledger books of case records and packets of citations (c.1400 pieces); 2) correspondence, account books, canning labels, publicity about various business ventures of Samuel L. and Stephen R., 1880s-1920s, including material on building the North Hempstead Turnpike, 1880 (c.5000 pieces); 3) personal correspondence of Morris Treadwell and Tempie Russell, 1914-1915, black servants of the Hewlett family (c.300 pieces). Special collections within the Hewlett Family Papers are: 1) company catalogues, dated 1840-1880, describing industrial machinery and manufacturing processes, some in color, most illustrated with well-executed lithographs or line engravings (c.200); 2) picture postcards, 1900-1930 (c.300); 3) bound manuscript volumes, 18th and 19th century schoolbooks, exercise books, account books, atlases, and journals. (Of particular note are several copy books, 1829-1830, belonging to Elizabeth Robbins, containing charming watercolor drawings executed while a student at Woodbury Academy, Long Island.); 4) 18th and 19th century maps, drawings and plans (c.50); 5) late 19th and early 20th century photographs of Hewlett family members and friends and local scenes (c.200); 5) calling cards, trade cards, dating from 1860s-1890s, mostly of local business significance (c.250); 6) postal stamps and cancellations, 1850s-1930s (c.1000).

In sum, the material includes legal documents, personal correspondence, maps, financial documents, advertising circulars, account books, school books and inventories. Most of the collection relates to the Hewlett family's role in the changing economic fortunes of Long Island during the 19th century, although the earliest documents go back to the 1680s and the most recent date to 1916.
